

New College Village



New College Village (NCV) opened its doors in 2009 as the latest residential community within the University of New South Wales. New College Village seeks to provide strong academic and pastoral care support founded on Christian faith and values. NCV accepts men and women from a wide range of backgrounds and membership is open to people of all beliefs. It offers accommodation, academic assistance, pastoral care and community activities for over 300 postgraduate and a limited number of selected upper year or honours undergraduates. All areas of study are represented at New College Village.

Location:

New College Village is located on Anzac Parade on the western side of the UNSW Kensington campus. It is close to all University departments, facilities and services. NCV is on a main bus route to the city, railway, beach and various suburban shopping centres surrounding the campus.

Accommodation:

Residents are accommodated in a studio room or a five or six single bedroom apartment. Each apartment will have both male and female occupants, and contains a common kitchen area. The studio rooms will contain a kitchenette. Each room has a single bed, desk, chair and bookshelves. An ensuite and air-conditioning is provided in every room. Bed Linen is provided by New College Village, and is laundered each week. NCV also cleans rooms each week.

Academic/pastoral support:

Academic commitment is encouraged in every way possible at New College Village. Senior Residents live on each floor and are responsible for academic as well as pastoral welfare of students. In addition, there are Academic Tutors who are in their final years of their PhD. The Senior Residents and Academic Tutors report to the Dean who has overall responsibility for the welfare of all residents. Much attention is given to ensuring that residents settle into university and NCV life as quickly and as comfortably as possible.

Activities:

Sporting, social and cultural activities are an important part of life at New College Village. Residents are encouraged to participate in and/or support activities that suit their interests, and, as far as possible, to make a contribution to the life of New College Village, University and/or the local community. A wide range of sports will be played throughout the year. Other activities include music, drama, art and photography. Many events and activities will be organized by the Senior Residents in conjunction with the residents.

Catering

There will be both self-catered and limited catered options. The catered option provides 3 meals a day, 5 days a week (Mon-Fri) at a cost of \$75 per week OR Dinner 5 days a week (Mon-Fri) priced at \$40 per week, cafeteria style. The meals will be made and served at our other location across the road at 330 Anzac Parade. This catered option is only available to a limited number of residents.

Other Facilities:

A large main common room is available to all residents, as is a games room, reading room, Business Centre with access to printing and photocopying services, two outdoor courtyards, A roof top terrace, BBQ facilities and common rooms on each level with a plasma television. There is also a convenience store located on the first floor. Laundry facilities with coin-operated washing machines and dryers will be situated in the basement of the building. Ironing boards are provided on a shared basis, but residents need to provide their own iron.

Security:

The building has high levels of security. To maintain a safe living environment, residents will have their own student card access to operate the security door entrances to the NCV. A fire detection system is also installed throughout the building, and fire drills are conducted periodically.

Phones/Technology:

Each room is equipped with a phone, and a data link to provide computer and Internet access services. The phone has provision for free voice mail messages. A Business Centre equipped with computers, internet access, laser printer, photocopier and scanner, is available to all residents.

Fees:

In 2009 new residents will pay a registration fee of \$125. An initial deposit of \$2,000.00 will need to be made on acceptance of your offer as a contribution to the session fees of \$1000 and a bond of \$1000. Studio apartments (with a kitchenette) will cost \$295 per week and a room in a shared apartment will cost \$275 per week. The minimum stay at the NCV is 1 year. Residents wishing to stay for a different period of time will need to speak with the Dean for alternative arrangements.

Applications:

For admission, it is best to apply at least 3 months prior to your first semester of study.
